The project was based at the The Aarhus School of Architecture, but it also involved researchers at The Faculty of Humanities, University of South Denmark/Odense University, The Department of Sociology, Lancaster University and The Department of Comparative Literature and Modern Culture, University of Copenhagen. These institutions in conjunction with the Danish Research Councils financed the project.
